In an exclusive interview with Ceylon Today, Prof. Sarath Pieris, an expert in Applied Statistics at the Sri Lanka Institute of Information Technology (SLIIT), shared insights into the role of mathematics in higher education. He focused on the B.Sc. (Hons) in Financial Mathematics and Applied Statistics (FMAS) programme offered by SLIIT, which ensures a promising future for students interested in actuarial science. This article outlines the key points from the conversation with Prof. Pieris.

Mathematics and higher education

Mathematics is the foundation for various fields, including science, technology, engineering, computing, and actuarial science. It fosters analytical and creative thinking, problem-solving, logical reasoning, and the ability to provide proof. The GCE Ordinary Level examination is the first national assessment that evaluates students' mathematical proficiency in Sri Lanka. Encouragingly, the pass rate for Mathematics in GCE (O/L) has increased over the years.

For students looking to further their education in Mathematics, Combined Mathematics is a popular subject choice at the GCE Advanced Level, taking up two additional subjects. The number of students stitling for the Physical Science stream has increased from 32,075 in 2017 to 35.38 in 2022. Likewise, university eligibility rates have also improved, with the number of qualifying students rising from 17;534 in 2017 to 20,488 in 2023. However, despite these positive trends, not all qualifying students secure a place at a state university. The number of Physical Science students missing out on state university admissions has increased from 11,747 in 2017 to 11,930 in 2023. This highlights the need for alternative educational pathways for talented students wishing to pursue a mathematics and statistics career.

approved by the Ministry of Education, is approved by the Ministry of Education, is designed to produce actuarial graduates equivalent to international university graduates. Notably, Sri Lankan state universities do not offer undergraduate degrees in Actuarial Science, making this programme particularly significant.

What is Actuarial Science?

Pieris, actuarial science is a discipline that assesses financial risks in organisations, including insurance companies, financial institutions, and large production firms. Actuarial science plays a crucial role in risk management, ensuring the success and stability of businesses. Students enrolled in this degree will develop strong logical and analytical thinking skills, equipping

them to accurately analyse and predict financial risks. This skill set provides them with a competitive edge in the job market, where actuarial expertise is in high demand

The Nature of the FMAS Degree

The B.Sc. (Hons) in Financial
