


Figure 1: Graduate Output of the University

A total of 665 graduates have passed from the Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies which is 21.9% of the total output of the University. The faculty of Social Sciences has the highest percentage with 857 graduates, which is 28.1% of the total output. The Faculty of Medicine represents the lowest percentage with 211 graduates, which is 6.9% of the total output. The Faculty of Humanities released 604 graduates this year, 19.8% of the total. Also, 486 students have passed from the Faculty of Science, which is 15.9% of the total graduation output.




Figure 2: Graduate Output by Gender in the Faculties




Figure 3: Graduate Output by the Result Obtained FCMS




Figure 4: Graduate Output by Gender, Faculty of Commerce & Management Studies




Figure 5: Graduate Output by the Result Obtained Faculty of Computing Technology




Figure 6: Graduate Output by Gender Faculty of Computing Technology




Figure 7:: Graduate Output by Result Obtained Faculty of Humanities




Figure 8: Graduate Output by Gender Faculty of Humanities




Figure 9: Output by Results Obtained Faculty of Medicine




Figure 10: Graduate Output by Gender Faculty of Medicine




Figure 11: Figure 10: Output by Result Obtained Faculty of Sciences




Figure 12: Graduate Output by Gender Faculty of Sciences




Figure 6: : Output by Result Obtained Faculty of Social Sciences




Figure 7: Graduate Output by Gender Faculty of Medicine




Figure 8: Total percentage of students who passed out.

The table presented above displays the highest pass percentages in various faculties of a university. It is noteworthy that most faculties have the second class - upper division as the highest result obtained.
